A copy of the assessment would then need to be submitted to the Odette School of Business. Course exemptions will only be considered after transfer credit has been assessed.

**Note**: to complete the Post-Graduate Certificate in Accounting, students must obtain residency requirements (minimum 6 courses taken at UWindsor), including <u>ACCT 4590</u>, <u>ACCT 4600</u>, and <u>ACCT 4610</u>. Exemptions and/or transfer credits are not accepted for these courses.
