Courses used to calculate the major average are: Courses listed under requirements (a) to (f), and any courses taken in the major area of study (FILM).

Sample Sequencing

Year 1 fall (5 courses): FILM-1100, FILM-1900, GART-1500, 2 non-FILM electives.

Year 1 winter (5 courses): FILM-1110, FILM-1001, GART-1510, 2 non-FILM electives.

Year 2 (10 courses): FILM-2100, FILM-2200, FILM-2300, FILM-2400, FILM-2500, FILM-2600, 2 of CMAF-2400/2410/3430, 2 non-FILM electives.

Year 3 (10 courses): FILM-3100, 3 other 3000-level FILM- courses, 6 non-FILM electives (* Check to ensure specific elective categories, such as Social Science, Languages/Science, excluding Arts, etc. are satisfied.)

Year 4 (10 courses): FILM-4100, FILM-4105, FILM-4900, at least 1 other 3000-level FILM course, 6 courses from any area of study, including further FILM courses available.
