Email submissions will still be accepted and any letters of intent previously submitted by returning sessionals will be considered accordingly. It would be helpful to the process if applicants can include their teaching availability in their letter – Days of the week (Monday to Friday) and whether they can teach DAYS (8:30 am to 4:00 pm); EVENINGS (4:00 pm to 10:00 pm); or BOTH.

Returning applicants who have previously taught as a sessional instructor at the University of Windsor within the last 2 years can either use the form link above or submit a letter of intent to return which must include a list of specific courses for which they wish to be considered. (WUFA Article 54:08 (a)). Although not required, applicants are encouraged to provide an updated CV and brief statement of qualifications to assist in the selection process.

New applicants can also either use the link above or email and must include: a cover letter clearly identifying the course(s) applying for and a brief explanation of qualifications; CV/resume; two current letters of reference forwarded directly by the referees to the email below; and evidence of qualifications.
