"With respect to those students who have applied for and been accepted for Assistantships, the Assistant will not be paid for any shortfall of hours at the end of their respective program, provided the University has satisfied its obligation to post available positions each term in writing and on the AAU website and to offer the minimum terms of support in accordance with Article 13:01 (a) & (b) and provided that the Assistant has applied in writing or via e-mail by the application deadline for each term until they have received the minimum terms of support in accordance with Article 13:01 (a) & (b)."

Eligibility requirements:

GA appointments shall be offered in accordance with the criteria specified in Article 12:03 of the Collective Agreement. The following are *essential qualifications* required for the appointments above:

- Must be a full time registered student at the time of hiring and maintain registration throughout the appointment
- Must be available to attend lecture/labs/exams at specified times

Required Essential Qualifications

EDUC 5203: Preference given to applicants with background knowledge; Degree in in Psychology would be an asset.

EDUC 5204: <u>Required</u>: Must have good communication skills and must be available to attend classes. Must be able to navigate/utilize Blackboard for instructional and communicative purposes. <u>Preferred</u>: Preference will be given to appliants who have a background in special education.

EDUC 5211: <u>Required:</u> Well organized; good written and verbal communication skills; Must be available to attend exams at specified times and provide 1 hour per week of office hours to meet with students. <u>Preferred</u>: Preference will be given to applicants with background and/or experience in special education and/or mental health.

EDUC 5207: Interest and experience in international service-learning,

EDUC 5209: Excellent oral and written communication skills; Knowledge of teaching and learning; Interest in co-teaching opportunities.

EDUC 5314: Excellent English language proficiency.

EDUC 5315: Preference for applicants with P/J experience (including pre-service teaching)

EDUC 5316: <u>Required</u>: Good communication and organization skills. <u>Preferred</u>: Preference will be given to applicants with background in music

EDUC 5312: Preference given to applicant with background in Information and Communication Technologies; Preference given to applicants with research interest in ICT.

EDUC 5324: Excellent English language proficiency.

EDUC 5332: Experience with creating digital artifacts; Professional experience with Twitter/Instagram; Familiar with Google docs; Understanding of UDL (Universal Design for Learning); Excellent organizational skills.

EDUC 5326/53675/368: Ability to read music; knowledge of music and music instruments.

EDUC 5356 I & II: <u>Required</u>: Must have very strong written and verbal English proficiency; Background in literacy, literature and language learning an asset. Excellent computer skills. <u>Preferred</u>: Preference to applicants with English Methodology teachable

EDUC 5374/5376: <u>Required</u>: Must be available to attend classes. <u>Preferred</u>: Preference will be given to applicants with Science education background

EDUC yyyy: Good communication skills with diverse student body; Bilingual competence in English and Chinese is an asset; Ability to monitor on-line discussions and to fulfill all duties on campus. Previous positive teaching experience; Interest in teacher education and K-12 education.

Please Note:

• A student must maintain **full time** registration throughout the term and must be in good standing in the degree program to hold a Graduate Assistantship. A full graduate assistantship according to the Collective Agreement requires an average of 10 hours per week for a maximum of 140 hours per semester.
