WHAT CAN WE DO FOR YOU?

We are here to support you as teachers, researchers, and educational leaders. We draw on evidence-based practices to develop courses, programs, and services to help establish instructional conditions that inspire student engagement, foster student success, and contribute to the development of vibrant programs of study. Some of our programs and services include:

- The University Teaching Certificate (UTC), designed to help academics at all levels and in all disciplines develop their teaching practice
- Courses on a range of teaching topics including lecturing, leading discussions, learning-centred teaching, and course design
- An Indigenizing Curriculum & Pedagogy workshop series featuring invited speakers on Indigenous pedagogy, medicine, and related topics
- Grants to support teaching and learning research, innovations, and dissemination
- Curriculum Services, including workshops, resources, and tools for course, curriculum, learning outcome, and program design
- Support for the development of teaching dossiers for tenure, promotion, and external teaching awards
- Early career faculty mentorship, and support for educational leaders
- Scholarship of teaching and learning support for research design and dissemination
- A newsletter and blog with insights into topical issues in teaching and learning
- Support for integration and use of technology for teaching, learning, and educational innovation, including training for the use of Blackboard Learn as a teaching tool
