In accordance with Article 12:01 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement the Department of Interdisciplinary and Critical Studies invites applications for the following projected TA positions for Winter term 2025.

All positions are subject to sufficient enrolment and final budgetary approval.

Expected TA duties:

Projected duties are in accordance with article 14:03 and may include but are not limited to the following:

- Attending scheduled face-to-face classes and assisting instructor
- Assisting students during office hours (as needed/indicated by course instructor)
- Marking writing assignments
- Providing online assistance to students as needed
- Assisting in course preparation as needed by course instructor

Assistants cannot commence their GA/TA duties until email confirmation of the approval of their contract is received from Human Resources (email titled “Authorization to Commence GA/TA Duties”).

TA employees are expected to make themselves available to report for all assigned duties, **both in-person/on-campus and remote/online duties**. Most classes across the University are held face-to-face on campus, and even online classes may require on-campus face-to-face duties.

Eligibility requirements:

Successful applicants must be available to attend at the specified time of the course/lab/exams as well as to report for all assigned duties, which may include both in-person/on-campus and remote/online duties.

TA appointments shall be offered to qualified applicants in accordance with the criteria specified in Article 12:04 of the CUPE4580 Collective Agreement.

To be eligible for a Teaching Assistantship you must be a registered undergraduate student:

- must be registered for the term of work at the time of hiring
- must maintain registration throughout the term and must be in good standing in the degree program
- must be legally eligible to work in Canada on campus with a valid social insurance number and a valid study permit.

Teaching Assistants can be employed for no more than 100 TA hours per semester total per Article 14 of the CUPE 4580 Collective Agreement. If you already hold or have applied for another TA position (in this or another department) note that the **total combined hours** for all TA appointments held in all departments **cannot exceed 100 hours for the Winter term period (Jan. 1st to April. 30).**

Required essential qualifications:

Successful applicants must meet all essential qualifications.

- A minimum major average of 75% (B) and a cumulative average of 60% (C-)
- Applicant must have taken the course in which they submit a TA application for
- Applicant must be available to proctor the final exam (as needed/communicated by course instructor)
- Applicant must be available to attend weekly classes (for face-to-face, synchronous, and asynchronous courses, as needed)
- Applicant must be available to mark written work from students
- Applicant must demonstrate proficiency in written English (on application)
- Applicant must demonstrate proficiency in oral communication (interviews may be conducted)

Preferred qualifications:

- Preference will be given to qualified applicants who have previously taken and successfully passed (75% or higher) the course(s) in which they submit a TA application for.
- Preferred TA experience in the course applied for, or another related course.
