

The Leddy Library occupies two buildings and is accessed via the entrance on the south side of the main building. The entrance is ramped to facilitate wheelchair access. Inside, all floors in both library buildings are serviced by elevators. The two buildings are connected by a walkway on the first and second floors. In the Main Building, the elevators are located on the north side of the main stairway in the centre of the building. In the West Building, the elevator is located on the west wall beside the main stairway.
