


Universal washrooms are located on the basement floor in the Leddy West Building and on every floor in Building.




How to find journal articles...

- Define your topic
 - list key words or phrases that reflect your topic and think of similar words and phrases so that you have a selection of these that you can use for searching the databases
- Use thesauri such as the <u>Oxford Paperback Thesaurus</u> to find similar words and phrases for the key words and phrases for your topic - some databases may have a <u>thesaurus</u> that you can use to find the most appropriate terms for your research for that particular database
- Make use of Search Tips and Help screens for whatever database you are using so that you can be sure that you are making use of all of the database's search options and search capabilities


Finding journal articles continued...

- Choose the appropriate databases
 - e.g., peer reviewed journal articles SPORTDiscus;
 newspaper articles Canadian Newsstand
- Choose Advanced Search for the database and make use of limit options – publication year limits, peer reviewed limits etc. – in order to do a more focused search
- Consider your research interests and whether or not they overlap with other subject areas as well as Human Kinetics – if so, take a look at databases listed for other relevant library subject guides – see: Resources by Subject

Government Publications



The Leddy Library Government Publications Collection aims to meet the information and research needs of the Library's users, to support academic programs, and to meet the responsibilities of being a depository collection for Canadian and Ontario publications and data. The Leddy Library has been a full depository for Canadian federal publications since 2000 and a selective depository since 1977. It is also a federal depository for maps and the National Topographic Database (NTDB) data.

The Library has been a full depository for Ontario government publications since 1972. We are also participants in the Data Liberation Initiative (DLI), the Inter-university Consortium for Political and Social Research (ICPSR), the Ontario Geospatial Data Exchange (OGDE), and a number of other consortial arrangements. This allows researchers fully subsidized access to Canadian and American data files and cd-roms. At the municipal level, the Library has maintained the Microlog Local Government microfiche collection since 1980. Quite extensive collections of United Nations, OECD, ILO, WHO, and World Bank publications are also held. Publications and data from other jurisdictions and government organizations are purchased selectively.

The book and journal collection is housed primarily on the 2nd floor of the main building and is shelved according to the CODOC classification scheme. These government publications are all catalogued and can be searched in the Library Catalogue.
