What is the Clinical Learning Centre (CLC)?

- Lab space on campus and virtually
- Resource for students, faculty, and staff
- Provides learning opportunities through appointments with peer mentors (in person and virtual) and open lab practice.
- A safe, judgment free atmosphere to ask questions about skills, clinical assignments, and much more.
- The CLC consists of the General (GEN)
 nursing lab and the Simulation (SIM) nursing
 lab.

General Nursing Lab

The general lab is located in Toldo & the Medical Education Building (MEB). These two buildings are attached.

The general lab consists of:

- Main office
- 6-bed practice lab with new mid-fidelity manikins
- 6-bed nursing skills lab including a medication room with a PYXIS machine
- 4-bed practice lab
- 8-bed experiential learning lab (MEB)
- 2 primary care rooms with viewing station (MEB)

General lab information

- The general lab is open for a variety of hours to meet the nursing students' needs.
- We book peer mentor appointments so you can have one on one time with a peer mentor.
- We offer virtual appointments.
- The general lab provides support, education, and expertise to assist the nursing students to be successful with hands on skills at their clinical settings.







It is **normal** to need support when facing a challenge or experiencing painful emotions.



Asking for help is always strong and brave, it is never weakness.



By reaching out for support, you are taking **care** of yourself and working to find a way through the challenge. This is **resilience** in action.



At UWindsor, we want you to tell us if you are struggling so we can **support** you. There are **safe**, caring professionals who are here to help. You are not alone.

When should I seek professional help for my mental health?

"I'm struggling... but I'm not sure if I need counselling"

You could benefit from student health, counselling & wellness services if:

- You are having difficulty with your daily living routine (trouble sleeping, eating, attending classes, feeling isolated etc.)
- You are having a hard time coping or adjusting to changes
- You are struggling with difficult or upsetting thoughts or feelings; or there is a troubling situation you are dealing with.

Students make appointments for many different reasons:

Excessive stress Boundaries Panic and/or Anxiety Substance use Disordered Eating Depression Abuse (verbal, emotional, Relationship issues physical, sexual) (family, roommates, significant others) Trauma Processing difficult Grief events Suicidal thoughts

What kind of help is available to me if I am struggling?

- **Single Session/Drop-in appointment** if you have a specific issue and would like to talk to a professional asap, you can choose a single session to get a different perspective or some tools to use. This is a one-time, single counselling session with one of the SCC therapists.
- <u>Group Sessions</u> Whether you want to overcome challenges, improve relationships, connect with others, or learn new skills, there is a place for you.
 - ➤ CBT- learn how to use Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) tools to help manage anxiety & your mood
 - ➤ **ADHD** improve your executive functioning, learn skills to manage symptoms associated with ADHD
 - > **DBT** learn skills to improve relationships, deal with conflict, manage your emotions, cope with distress, and be more mindful.
 - ➤ Plus, many more! 2SLGBTQIA+ & Black student specific groups, social anxiety, self-compassion- just check the link to see what is offered each semester
- Brief Initial Consultation if you aren't sure where to start, you can schedule an
 appointment for a brief consultation we will assess your concerns and set you up with
 a course of action- whether this be referrals to resources and programs on or off
 campus or short-term counselling, our therapists can help point you in the right
 direction.

- 2. Our office administrators will give you confidentiality & informed consent documents to register for our services. They will also ask what service you are interested in (single session, group, brief initial consultation) and how you would like to connect. Our services are offered in-person, via secure videoconference, or by telephone (*groups are in person or online)
- 3. After the forms are completed, they will schedule you for an assessment and/or a session.

Our services are <u>confidential</u> and offered at <u>no additional cost</u> to students currently enrolled at the University of Windsor

Clinical Placement Process

- 1. If you have not done so yet, please activate your uwindsor.ca email address.
- 2. The clinical placement team will register you into your clinical placements for year 3.
- 3. Before your registration date Check for an email from Susan Rotondi- Moore with instructions! It is very important that you follow these instructions.
- 4. Remember wherever you are placed you will be responsible for your transportation to and from your clinical placement.

Conflict of Interest

- Students must notify the clinical team if you identify a conflict of interest as soon as possible
- Students who are employed as UNEs or RPNs in hospital please notify Sue Rotondi Moore at <u>srotond@uwindsor.ca</u> so that we do not place you on a unit you work
- Conflicts can include family members in your group, unit/agency of placement, or instructor/faculty advisor

Clinical Pre-Clearance Overview

- Hospitals and community agencies mandate that students meet specific medical and non-medical requirements.
- Students need to be cleared annually- University of Windsor is now using <u>Verified Synergy Gateway</u> to complete the screening process.
- Flexible appointment scheduling.
- Confidentiality and privacy maintained.
- ► Fees for screening available on the Synergy ERV forms found on the Pre- Clearance information link found on the main University of Windsor Nursing page.

How to do your Synergy pre-clinical clearance:

- Activate your uwindsor.ca email this is so synergy can send you your account information.
- ☐ Make sure you can log into your **Verified Synergy gateway** account.
- Upload all your required documents and completed forms to your Verified Synergy profile as directed
- Any time after **June 1**st **2024** make an appointment for review of your documents on Synergy once everything is uploaded. **Please Note: There is a fee for each time a review is done so please ensure you have <u>all</u> the requirements uploaded <u>and</u> that they will all be valid until last day of all your clinical placements this year before making the appointment to avoid additional fees and delays of your clearance.*
- □ Be prepared to bring a hard copy of your Verified Synergy clearance to your clinical orientation. In September.

Due Dates to complete Clearances is August 19th 2024

Initial appointments for reviews can take up to 48 hours to be done additional reviews can take longer. Please consider that when making your appointments.

Some changes to make note of for 2024

Annual CPR requirement- Only will accept BLS or HCP (Health care provider)

Annual SMG- Non-Violent Crisis intervention training: Students/Instructors are required to complete:

SMG- Crisis Intervention Training module (initial if you have never taken it before or refresher if you have taken it before)

SMG- CIT- Physical techniques online module (this course is the same in both the initial or refresher bundle)

SMG has stated that these courses are required to be taken no more than 30 days apart to be valid
