
Introduction

Programs: FAHSS offers over fifty <u>undergraduate</u> and <u>graduate</u> programs and a wide range of unique certificates and minors in the creative and performing arts, humanities and culture, and social sciences and professional studies.

Accreditations: The Department of Social Work is accredited by the <u>Canadian Association of Social</u> <u>Work Education</u> and the Department of Psychology is accredited by the <u>Canadian Psychological</u> Association.






- Graduation Rate (2019/20)^{2,3}: Fine & Applied Arts 69%; Humanities 66%; Social Sciences 59%

- Number of tenured or tenure-track faculty (2019/20): 171


Best Practices

- FAHSS takes pride in their student-centred approach that allows learners the flexibility and support to create their own educational experience whether that be through combining programs and certificates or minors across different areas, taking a double-major degree program, or through immersion in some of our unique interdisciplinary experiences⁵.
 - The FAHSS <u>PASS</u>, <u>Fresh Start</u>, and <u>Flourish</u> programs help students develop skills for academic success. The Flourish program, established in 2022, is intended to assist with upper year student retention.
 - The FAHSS <u>Transform</u> program, established in 2021, helps students transition from high school to university. This program is intended to positively impact onboarding, cohort building, preparedness and retention.
 - The <u>FAHSS App</u> allows students easy access to learning communities, peer and mental health supports, important academic and non-academic information, and quick answers to their questions - all at their fingertips through their phone.
- FAHSS offers important opportunities for students to learn outside of the classroom and to develop life and employment skills including competencies in research and leadership to allow you to help solve the big picture problems.
 - Undergraduate and graduate research opportunities in the community and abroad are readily available in FAHSS, alongside peer mentorship and leadership training, engagement, and application. This training is also recognized through FAHSS's <u>LEAD Scholar medallion program</u> upon graduation.
