BIOM 1073-01 Introductory Medical Microbiology Lecture	This introductory course provides a foundation in microbiology relating to Nursing. Key concepts in the biology of infectious agents, human-microbe interactions, mechanisms of microbial diseases, control of microbial growth, immunology, epidemiology, and public health. Lecture: In person Wednesdays 4:00pm-6:50pm
BIOM 2021-01 Human Anatomy Lecture	Systemic analysis of the structure of the human body, including gross and microscopic morphology. Topics include anatomical terminology and structures of cells, tissues and the major organ systems. Practical laboratory will complement lectures with emphasis on gross dissection. Lecture: In person Thursdays 4pm-6:50pm
BIOM 3750-01 Cancer Undergraduate Research Education (CURE) Lecture	CURE will engage students in learning about the science of cancer and directions in cancer research. Students will interact with scientists conducting a spectrum of multidisciplinary research and will work in collaborative teams to design and implement tools to communicate cancer research to the public, to patients, to other students and to the government. Students will discuss ethical fundraising and marketing of research and will compose ideas to support cancer research. This course will be hands on learning where your ideas will directly contribute to moving cancer research forward in Windsor-Essex. (Prerequisites: BIOL-1101 and registration in third year of a program.) (Previously offered as SCIE-3750, this course does not count towards a major course credit in Biological Sciences or BCN degrees but can be used as an additional Science course or any area of study credit.) (3 hours a week lecture/ experiential learning). In person Tuesdays and Thursdays 10am-11:20am
