Extensive Support for Teaching


- 5,700 total participants, 1,656 unique people in 146 formal CTL courses, programs, workshops including
 - Early Career Faculty Support
 - Mid- to late-career support including involving 22 as facilitators
 - Teaching and Learning Senior Scholars Program, a fellowship for retired faculty members
 - GA/TA Support
 - Sessional instructors support



Extensive Support for Teaching

- Participants from all Faculties with approximately 60% of faculty attending registered workshops
- Additional consultations over 1,000 hours
- University Teaching Certificate (UTC) saw growth
- Supported curriculum development, revision, and mapping
- Launched the Curriculum Services website, a "one-stop shop"

- Grants: CLIF, CTL Travel Grants, etc.


CTL Research in Teaching and Learning
