## Campus Update—Appointment of Dr. Cláudio Verani as Dean of the Faculty of Science.

Following a highly competitive search process, Prof. Cláudio Verani, Ph.D., has accepted a five-year appointment as Dean of the Faculty of Science at the University of Windsor, starting on July 15, 2024.

Verani comes to us from Wayne State University, where he rose through the professorial ranks after his initial appointment as Assistant Professor of Chemistry in 2002. Conducting research in bioinorganic and in physical-inorganic chemistry, Verani has contributed to the fields of molecular electronics and quantum computing, as well as to the mechanistic understanding of fuel production from water. He is interested in environmentally benign metal recovery and corrosion mitigation and has worked on metal-containing drugs that inhibit tumor cell growth.

Verani received his B.Sc. in Chemistry (1994) and M.Sc. in Bioinorganic Chemistry (Honors, 1996) at the Universidade Federal de Santa Catarina in Brazil. He pursued a Ph.D. degree (2000) at the Max-Planck Institute and the Ruhr Universität-Bochum, and later took up postdoctoral work at the Johns Hopkins University.

For the last seven years, Verani has served as Associate Dean for research in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, overseeing the research activity of twenty departments across the Humanities, Life, Physical and Social Sciences. He led the restructuring of the research support team and the proposal submission process, introduced annual grant writing workshops for faculty, and managed the Mid-Career Fund for Research Infrastructure. He was responsible for physical space, research labs and instrument cores, IT infrastructure, aspects of faculty affairs, community engagement, and special projects serving the needs of faculty, staff, and students across WSU's largest faculty.
