4.2: Sessional Lecturers Standing on Councils

Item for: Discussion

Several AAUs have Sessional Lecturers either on permanence-track or with permanence, however, these faculty positions are not yet accounted for in the Senate bylaws. Therefore, individuals holding these positions have no standing in the governance of their AAU other than where they are permitted to serve on Council under 4.1.4 "such other persons related to the functioning of the unit, whether or not holding an appointment in the University, as the Council may admit to membership, subject to the limitations of 4.1.5." In all cases, Sessional Lecturers are not permitted to participate in appointments or RTP procedures.

Similar to other ranking faculty, Sessional Lecturers either on permanence-track or with permanence have a long-term interest in the directions and decisions of their AAU, yet their participation and voting rights are less than those granted to their peers and even their students. Students on AAU councils may participate in appointments and RTP procedures. The Senate Governance Committee is asked to rectify this inequality. To quote one Sessional Lecturer: "It's very important to me that my voice be recognized as equal to my colleagues and students when we're making long-term decisions that will affect the department I work in."

PROPOSED ACTION:

If the Senate Governance Committee agrees that changes to the bylaws to provide standing to Sessional Lecturers should be pursued, it would task the Bylaw Review Committee to further investigate the matter and determine whether and how this could be accomplished, taking into account their significant role in the teaching and learning objectives and outcomes of their department and the university, while being mindful of any limitations that may occur as a result of their being eight-month positions.
