#### University of Windsor Students Alliance (UWSA)

Members were also informed that the UWSA is having a referendum to determine if students are in favour of UWSA allowing plans to move the bookstore into the CAW Centre basement. Students will be able to vote on December 3<sup>rd</sup> from noon until midnight. It was noted that UWSA is working in collaboration with organizers for the Windsor International Film Festival (WIFF) in order to be able to provide free tickets to students to preview movies. UWSA will also be hosting a WIFF after party on the second floor of the City Grill.

It was noted that UWSA has teamed up with the Student Counseling Centre to create a space on campus where students will feel welcome to talk to their peers about a variety of issues. UWSA is currently in the process of hiring volunteers for the new center. It is anticipated that this new initiative will help alleviate stress for students in need. Senators were reminded that Anti-Bullying Week commences the week of November 12<sup>th</sup> and that Senators can support this endeavor on Thursday by wearing the colour blue to symbolize anti-bullying.

# Organization of Part-Time University Students (OPUS)

Members were informed that OPUS continues to work towards meeting objectives in its Strategic Plan in order to continue to align resources with strategic priorities. OPUS is also moving forward with a part-time student survey focusing on student engagement. In an effort to engage students, OPUS recently hosted a pub night at Buddies eatery. #### 5.8 Report of the Provost

Senators were informed that the Search Committee will soon be announcing candidates for the new Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences.

Members were informed that Leddy Library recently completed its new Strategic Plan, which includes five new strategic directions to guide and define success for the upcoming year(s). The strategic directions are: 1) Enabling an inviting and successful library experience; 2) Expanding upon the Library's role as a hub for research and learning activities; 3) Taking a leadership role in scholarly communication; 4) Supporting a culture of lifelong learning, skills development and customer service excellence for all library personnel; and, 5) Telling our Story. Faculty and staff were thanked for their contributions during the University's Open House, which was held today. Members were informed that the University community put forth a great deal of effort and coordination to ensure that everything was in order for the guests.

The floor was open for comments and questions.

In response to a question raised about the University rankings, it was noted that the University of Windsor's rankings vary depending on whether the reviews are in the Globe and Mail or MacLean's. Although the rankings in the Globe and Mail were disappointing, it was stressed that the survey is not scientific based and therefore not really an honest and accurate reflection of the University of Windsor. However, the University of Windsor remains in the middle of the pack in the rankings of comprehensive universities by Maclean's magazine. It was also noted that the information gathered through the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) is more reflective and meaningful as it is focuses more on student engagement. It was noted that under the leadership of the Vice-Provost, Students International, a Committee is reviewing survey results in order to identity strengths, weaknesses, etc.

In response to a comment made regarding the issue that less than half of the student population completed the G&M survey (*i.e.*, 457), it was noted that in the future the student leaders should encourage their peers to complete the surveys so that positive feedback could also be included in the overall rankings.
