Recognizing suspicious packages

UNUSUAL APPEARANCE:

Be wary of packages that appear to be out of place, have no clear sender or recipient, or are wrapped in an unusual manner.

UNEXPECTED DELIVERY:

If you receive a package you were not expecting or if it was left in a location where packages are not typically delivered, approach with caution.

UNUSUAL ODORS OR

SOUNDS: Packages emitting strange odors or making unusual sounds should be treated as suspicious.

STRANGE MARKINGS OR

LABELS: Pay attention to any suspicious markings, stains, or labels on the package.

What to do if you find a suspicious package

DO NOT TOUCH OR MOVE IT:

Avoid touching the package to minimize the risk of triggering any potential hazards such as explosives, chemicals, or biological agents.

EVACUATE THE AREA:

If the package is indoors, calmly evacuate the immediate area and alert others to do the same. Follow established evacuation procedures and move to a safe distance away from the suspicious package.

NOTIFY AUTHORITIES:

Contact campus security or local law enforcement immediately to report the suspicious package. Provide them with as much information as possible, including the location of the package and any relevant details about its appearance.

FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS:

Follow any instructions provided by campus security or law enforcement officials regarding evacuation, sheltering in place, or other necessary precautions.

DO NOT USE ELECTRONIC DEVICES:

Avoid using cell phones or electronic devices near the suspicious package, as they could potentially trigger explosive devices.
