Medical Emergency

When on scene of an incident requiring medical attention:

- 1. Remain calm and assess the situation
 - the cause of the medical problem (accident, fall, fire, explosion, etc.)
 - the scope of the medical problem (single or multiple victim, mass casualties)
 - the proximity/immediate danger of the medical emergency (fire or chemical spill nearby)
 - the type of medical problem the victim(s) has sustained (bleeding, broken bones)
 - determine the level of seriousness of the injury (Less Serious, Moderately Serious, Critical/Life Threatening Situation)
- 2. Obtain permission from the victim, if possible
- 3. Immediately administer first aid, watching for signs of shock (fainting, pale, shallow breathing)
 - stop the bleeding, if required
 - perform CPR, if trained and required
 - administer the Automatic External Defibrillator (AED), if required
- 4. Do not, unless absolutely necessary, leave the victim, as the status of the medical situation can suddenly change. Other staff or bystanders can be utilized if needed to get a first aid kit, meet an ambulance, control the crowd, assist in first aid, etc.
- 5. Contact or have someone contact extension 911 on any university phone or 911 on a cell phone and state
 - exact location at the medical emergency
 - the number of victims and level of seriousness of the injury to the victim(s)
 - cause and scope of the medical problem
 - if required, request the attendance of
 - Emergency Medical Services
 - Fire Services
 - Campus/City Police
- 6. Only move items/alter conditions to prevent further injury or reduce the threat to life, if possible
- 7. Reassure the victim and inform them that help is on the way
- 8. Consult with other persons on scene who may have information relating to the incident
- 9. Obtain descriptions of suspects and vehicles and notify extension 911 or 911
- 10. If <u>evacuation</u> is required
 - calmly advise the victim that you are moving them
 - request assistance from others
 - stop or reduce bleeding
 - attempt to immobilize the victim as much as possible using a flat surface (e.g. door)
 - notify extension 911 or 911 that you are moving, and your intended route
 - upon exiting, seek immediate medical care for the victim
 - report to university officials/emergency responders other trapped or injured persons

Epidemic/Contagious Condition

When an epidemic or contagious condition exists:

- 1. Practice prevention (flu shot, wash hands often, cover coughs, follow health advisories)
- 2. Follow all directions from university/health professionals regarding medical emergency plans
- 3. When feeling unwell, immediately seek medical attention
- 4. If diagnosed with a contagious condition, follow all directions/orders from medical personnel

If quarantined, follow all instructions and do not breach quarantine
