Severe Weather, Tornado, Earthquake

When severe weather, a tornado or earthquake occurs:

Severe Weather or Tornado

When a tornado is imminent or occurring

- 1. Immediately shelter on the lowest floor of a building in an interior room with the fewest windows, a basement, a center hallway, bathroom or closet
- 2. Locate nonperishable food, bottled water, battery-powered radios, first aid supplies, flashlights, batteries, plastic sheeting, garbage bags, or other emergency supplies
- 3. Remove or lower objects in the room that may become airborne or fall
- 4. Shelter under a sturdy desk, table or solid object
- 5. Stay away from bookcases and objects that may tip or fall over

Earthquake

When an earthquake occurs

- 1. Take cover (under a sturdy desk, table or solid object)
- 2. If outside, move away from buildings, walls, poles or objects that may fall/collapse **Note.** Do not go inside a building for shelter

Immediate Aftermath

- 1. Assess the situation (injuries, egress routes, hazards, etc.)
- 2. Assist others in exiting the building (do not use elevators unless directed)
- 3. Once outside, move away from the building, allowing emergency responder access
- 4. Report to university officials/emergency responders trapped or injured persons
- 5. Do not re-enter the building unless authorized
- 6. If there is a fire, and the fire appears controllable
 - activate the fire alarm system by pulling the nearest pull station
 - immediately call extension 911 on any university phone or 911 on a cell phone and provide
 - the exact location and intensity of the fire (gas leaks, etc.)
 - estimated number of persons and locations at risk due to the fire
 - follow instructions provided by the call-taker
 - if trained, use university firefighting equipment when the equipment is appropriate to the size and intensity of the fire
- 7. If the fire <u>does not</u> appear controllable
 - · activate the fire alarm, call extension 911 or 911 and provide the information listed above
 - locate any person in the vicinity of the fire, direct them to evacuate immediately and assist them, when practical
 - evacuate the building, closing doors (but don't lock) after all persons have exited
 - once outside, move away from the building, allowing emergency responder access
 - assist emergency responders, if requested
- 8. If trapped in the building due to the fire, go to a window away from the fire
 - hang something (article of clothing, towel) outside the window to mark your location
 - if no windows exist, stay near the floor and shout at regular intervals
 - await the arrival of and follow the directions of emergency responders
- 9. If trapped in the building due to a collapse, remain calm
 - assess your personal health (injuries, severity, etc.)
 - immediately address blood loss or other life threatening injuries
 - attempt to use a solid object to strike a nearby surface to signal your location

follow the directions of emergency responders
